### Walk-in Fracture Clinic

Injuries happen all the time, but never at a convenient time. To assist parents in obtaining prompt care for their children while avoiding ER waits and associated hospital expenses, we offer a daily walk-in clinic. New and urgent orthopaedic injuries are accepted from 9-11 a.m. and 1-3 p.m. Monday through Friday for children ages 0 to 14. For children who have not already had x-rays, we offer digital x-rays in office. Waterproof casting, custom splints, crutches, knee immobilizers and other orthopaedic products are also available. Injuries that require surgery are usually scheduled within 24 to 48 hours. Our team is also staffed with physician assistant and a Pediatric nurse practitioner to provide prompt and comprehensive pediatric orthopaedic care.



### Cerebral Palsy

Since 1995 I have devoted much of my time treating movement disorders and spasticity in children. Currently I treat patients from a surrounding 6 state area. My approach for Cerebral Palsy, pediatric stroke and other conditions that result in spasticity is personalized for each individual with botulinum toxin injections and minimally invasive surgery.
